



1: Overview - the Front **Range Flood Challenge:**

a. We show the looming potential of the watershed that could bear down on Boulder (with Channel 4's helicopter camera).

b.We discuss the extent of people living and working in harms way (Aerial images with overlays of creeks and floodplains)

- c. We relay the dangers/risks with the 1894 flood for historical comparison
- d. We urge community vigilence, individual safety and responsibility

2: A Worst Case Scenario:

A major flash flood hits at night or during rush hour. The one-hour lead time from flood warning is squandered for lack of knowledge / preparation. Many residents lose valuable property on ground floors. Chaos / triage ensues. Motorists race to get home or to get family members but are trapped and drowned in moving water. Needless minor rescues divert emergency workers from more vital situations - more perish. Others get swept away in creeks and drainage ditches.

Likely fatality statistics: 65% vehicle-related, 20% swept away / drowned, 10% electrocuted, 5% other.

3: What You Can Do:

Immediate

a. Have a plan and clear priorities b. Avoid driving and causing unnecessary complications / chaos

Long term

Flood proofing Flood insurance Store precious items higher Education on the power of moving water

4: Experts and **Testimonials:**
